## Principal's Message:

- You will be hearing about the Badger Exam. This is the replacement test for the WKCE tests. The $3^{\text {rd }}-8^{\text {th }}$ grades will be taking this in April/May timeframe. This is a computer based adaptive test similar to the MAP testing that students are used to taking.
- The Safe \& Orderly Committee will be having an assembly on February $19^{\text {th }}$ to hand out awards. Students in $4^{\text {th }}-6^{\text {th }}$ can nominate themselves or nominate someone else for an award. The leader of the pack award will still be nominated by teachers for all grades. There will be an ice cream party for students who win awards. Teachers will nominate students in grades K-3.
